<p>The FY 13 Security, Stability and Resiliency Framework was published for community input on 1 June 2012. This followed</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>the distribution of an advance copy of the Framework to the Security, Stability &amp; Resiliency Review Team under the Affirmation of Commitments in February 2012,</li> <li>discussion of the approach for the FY 13 Framework at the ICANN meeting in Costa Rica in March 2012,</li> <li>a presentation of the FY 13 Framework to SSAC and a small expert group in April 2012 (with their inputs incorporated into the Framework before publication in June),</li> <li>community consultations in May 2012, including a presentation at the Registry-Registrar Regional Gathering in Los Angeles, California on 17 May 2012 and a briefing with the IT Sector Coordinating Council International Committee.</li> </ul> <p>The ICANN Security team also conducted briefing sessions with the ccNSO, the Business Constituency, and an open community session on the FY 13 SSR Framework and draft statement of ICANN's role and remit in security, stability and resiliency at the ICANN meeting in Prague, Czech Republic in June 2012.</p> <p>For next steps, the FY 13 SSR Framework will be provided to the ICANN Board. The ICANN Security team will move continue to deliver on the initiatives described in the Framework and will publish regular status updates on its progress on the Security team web page. The team will also present an implementation plan to the ICANN Board on the recommendations of the SSR Review Team.</p>
